# Committee Descriptions

Any member, in good standing, can volunteer to serve on a NECSA committee. The Board of Directors and Associate Board are elected by the membership. All other volunteers are appointed by the Board of Directors.

## NECSA State Chapters

CT/ME/MA/NH/RI/VT

NECSA's State Chapters are responsible for representing and protecting the convenience store & fuel industry's legislative interests. Members participate in decisions regarding legislative priorities and work to improve grassroots legislative efforts. Committee members attend public hearings and meetings with legislators and government officials. They provide input about NECSA's programs and events in each state.



Each State Chapter determines priority issues and their meeting schedule. Generally, they meet monthly when their respective legislature is in session.

NECSA's State Chapters operate in each of the six New England states and each has a contract lobbyist.

## Membership Committee

The NECSA Membership Committee helps develop recruitment and retention plans each year.

Some of the Committee activities may include:

- Reviewing member benefits;
- Acting as a resource for membership questions/concerns;
- Developing a membership campaign;
- Following up with new members and potential members;
- Contacting lapsed members;
- Welcoming new members.

The Membership Committee meets quarterly.

## Education Committee

NECSA's Education Committee is responsible for determining the membership's educational and training needs and helping to implement programs to meet those specific needs.

The Committee also works with the Trade Show Committee in planning the educational workshops during the show.

The Education and Training Committee generally meets two times per year.

## Trade Show Committee

The Trade Show Committee is responsible for planning and implementing the Trade Show. This Committee also plans networking events makes recommendations to the Board of Directors.

The Committee sets fees, dates, locations, agendas, educational programs, business sessions, and social functions.

The Trade Show Committee generally meets two or three times per year.

## Golf Tournament Committee

NECSA's Golf Tournament Committee is responsible for planning the annual tournament. Their duties include setting fees, dates, and locations. They also determine the format and pair the golf foursomes. The Golf Tournament Committee generally meets twice per year.

## Board of Directors

The Board of Directors and Associate Board Directors are elected positions with terms. Potential nominees names are submitted to the Board for a nomination determination as required by NECSA's Bylaws and policies.

NECSA's Associate Board is responsible for creating and implementing NECSA's social, networking, and recognition programs.

The Associate Board members also act as judges for the Store Operator of the Year Award Program.

NECSA's Board of Directors establishes Association policies and approves expenditures.

The Board member's role is to guide the Association and to address the major issues facing the industry.

## Other Committees

Additionally, NECSA has a Finance Committee and a Long Range Planning Task Force that are appointed by the Board of Directors.
